

Possession in regular plurals (1)

For regular plurals, we use an apostrophe after the final **s** to show possession, like this – horses' hooves.

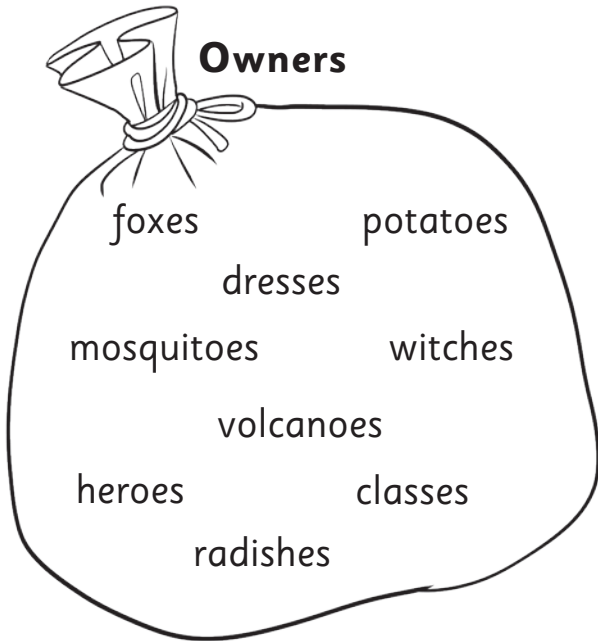
Possession in regular plurals (2)



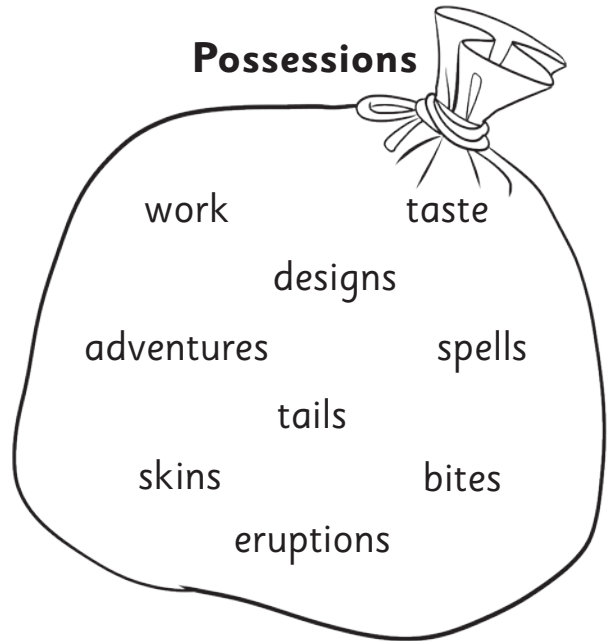
Plural nouns ending in **es** also use a final apostrophe to show possession, such as: *boxes' corners*.
