


## **SKILLS CHECK**

Writing in the **active voice** means that the subject of the sentence is doing or being something. If there is an object, it is what the subject is 'acting upon'.



Most writing is in the active voice, but sometimes the **passive voice** is used, often for a more formal effect.

In passive-voice sentences, the noun, pronoun or noun phrase that would be the **object** in an active-voice sentence becomes the **subject** and moves to the start of the sentence.



The subject from the original active-voice sentence moves to the end of the sentence, but it does not become the object. It becomes part of a **prepositional phrase** and is called **the agent**. It isn't always included though.

The man was chased.

You form the passive voice by combining the verb **'to be'** with the **past participle** of whatever verb you are using.
