Introduction and advice

In the reading section of the fiction exam you will be give an extract from a story or novel and some questions to answer on the text.

You will be tested against the following assessment objectives for reading:



- Identify and interpret explicit and implicit information and ideas.
- Select and synthesise evidence from different texts.



Explain, comment on and analyse how writers use language and structure to achieve effects and influence readers, using relevant subject terminology to support their views.



Compare writers' ideas and perspectives, as well as how these are conveyed, across two or more texts.



Evaluate texts critically and support this with appropriate textual references.
